MILWAUKEE IRISH FEST

Visit Ireland without the passport or plane ride! Come with us to the "largest and best Irish cultural event in North America!" Dancers, singers, a 40-voice choir, sporting events and parades are all a part of this great festival.

August 14 our Irish adventure begins at our guaranteed departure cities, stopping along the way for breaks and lunch. We'll arrive in the Milwaukee area and check into our hotel. Then we'll depart for downtown and the **Milwaukee Irish Fest** grounds, where we will join in the festival. Feel free to join your tour escort in dressing "festively!" The Irish Festival in Milwaukee began in 1981 to promote Irish culture through music, dance, cultural exhibits, drama and sports. The festival celebrates all aspects of Irish culture. The festival grounds are located on the waterfront in downtown Milwaukee. There's something everyone can enjoy: parades through the streets, top-notch Irish musical entertainment at numerous venues within the grounds, boat races, tugs-of-war and an Irish history area. You'll also find vendors selling Irish clothing, souvenirs, jewelry, food, drink and more.



August 15 after **breakfast**, a **step-on guide** will show us around downtown Milwaukee, including the **opening of "the wings" of the Milwaukee Art Museum, St. Josephat's Basilica** (patterned after St. Peter's in Rome) and many other landmarks in the downtown area. We then board the **Edelweiss** to enjoy a **lunch cruise** in the downtown area and around the festival grounds. After our cruise, we will return to the festival grounds to enjoy more of the **Irish Fest** entertainment, food, and atmosphere.



August 16 after **breakfast**, we stop in the small town of Mount Horeb, WI, where we'll enjoy a signature **lunch at Schubert's** old-fashioned café and bakery. (Their famous breads and pastries are on sale to take home!) Later, we tour the **Mustard Museum**. The museum began in 1986, when curator Barry Levenson started his collection of mustards. There are now 4,600 jars, bottles or tubes of mustard from all 50 states and more than 60 countries. Following an introductory video in "Mustardpiece Theatre," our guide will assist us in tasting many of the products. In addition to mustard, you'll find hot sauces, barbecue sauces, horseradish and clothing. We then return to our departure cities.
